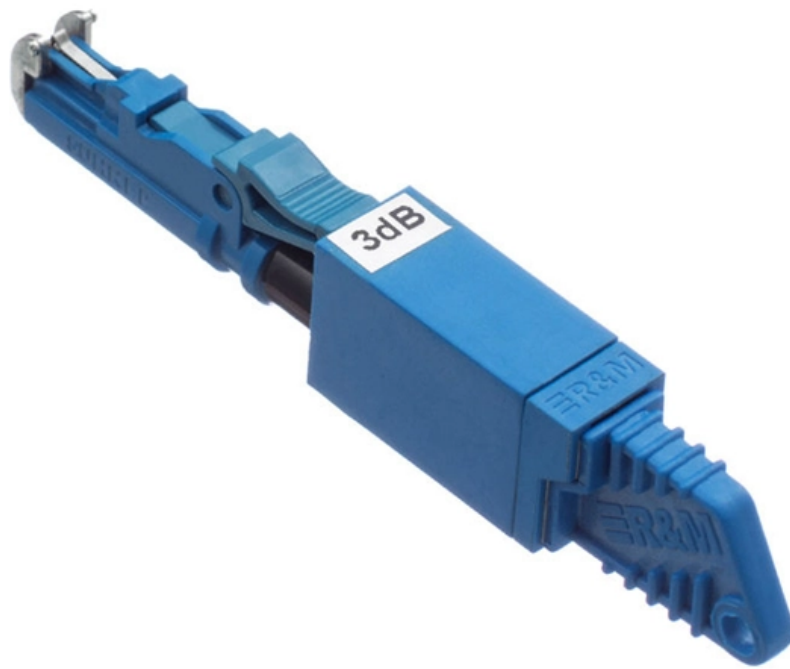


5-meter yellow tail fin





Overview

Yellowfin tuna are a torpedo-shaped fish, with dark metallic blue back, distinctive yellow sides, and a silver belly with many vertical lines. They have very long anal and dorsal fins which are bright yellow, which give the fish its name. The yellowfin tuna (*Thunnus albacares*) is a species of tuna found in pelagic waters of tropical and subtropical oceans worldwide. Yellowfin is often marketed as ahi, from the Hawaiian 'ahi, a name also used there for the closely related bigeye tuna (*Thunnus obesus*). Want to save this article?
